
Method – basic survey data

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Understanding of the term

What do you understand by "sexual harassment"?



Base: All interviewees / Data in % / Specified is the sum of "totally agree" and "somewhat agree"


Women "detect" sexual harassment easier than men. In particular, they are more likely to perceive "provocative or pornographic images" and "lewd remarks" in the workplace as sexually harassing.



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Personal experiences

How often have you experienced the following situations in the work context yourself?

Verbal forms of sexual harassment are those experienced most frequently.


Women rather tend to experience physical harassment, whereas men are more likely to suffer from visual or verbal forms of harassment.

Sexual harassment: concrete experiences and personal evaluation

Already experienced one form of harassment as referred to in the Act

Sexually harassed in the workplace, according to personal understanding of the term



One in two respondents has experienced harassment in the workplace that is prohibited by law.

One in 6 women and one in 14 men explicitly classify the incident as "sexual harassment". Both men and women report that men are perpetrators in most cases.



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

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
Perpetrator / harasser (gender)

Both men and women most frequently witness and experience harassment by men.




Sexual harassment is experienced

■ Women ■ Men



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Knowledge of statutory rights

What do you think are your statutory rights when you are being sexually harassed in the workplace?




Only every 5th employee knows that her or his employer has to protect her or him against harassment.

What types of measures exist in your workplace to prevent sexual harassment?




Almost every second interviewee is not aware of any measures against sexual harassment in her or his company. Only about one fifth of the respondents know about a contact person. Only about one tenth mention the existence of an agreement or a mission statement.

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Need for action (from the point of view of the respondents)

What do you think needs to be done to stop sexual harassment in the workplace in Germany?



More than half of the interviewees are in favor of nearly all of the suggested measures for the fight against sexual harassment in the workplace.

Only 14 % think that nothing has to be done at all.
